Terry Wilson, Gloria Lee and Jessica Wilson originally from Rebourne Western Australia, are a proud and dynamic Njamaal Yindjibarndi family with cultural ties that span across the Pilbara region.

Sean Wilson and the second Wilson family have been working in the Pilbara for over 20 years. Yalagan has worked across projects in the North-West with leading organisations such as FMG, CIVMEC and BHP since 2020.

NNT through a Third Party Agreement (TPA) with Yalagan Registered Training (YRT), now has the capabilities as a Registered Training Organisation and Group Training Organisation through Yalagan's Registered Training (YRT) RTO ID: (91627) and Yalagan Group Training (GTO) Organisations

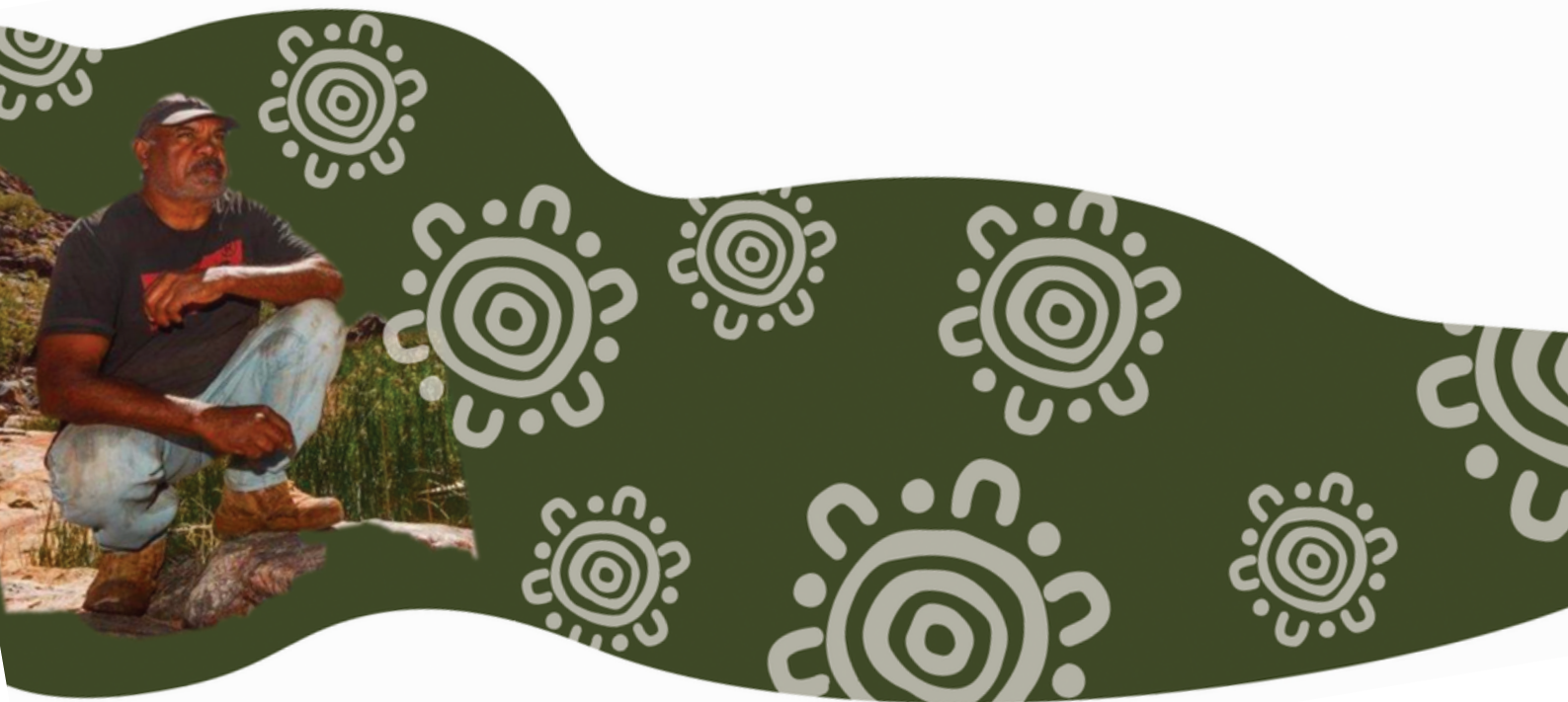
TERRY WILSON

Terry is a proud Njamal man having lived his whole life in the Pilbara. Following tribal initiation, Terry began working within the Yandeyarra Community near Port Hedland with the support of his Grandfather Sam Coppin, a cultural lore man and Elder who taught Terry all about his Country and culture.

Terry's career started at the age of 13 as a station hand mustering cattle. He moved on to roles involving his communities including as a Support Worker for young people at the Mawarnkarra Health Service in Roebourne, establishing the "Strong Men's Group". He worked with Moly Mines as the Indigenous and Cultural Liaison Officer and as Pit Supervisor working across different communities and on various explorations.

Terry is a member of the Njamal Trustee Committee established in 2003 as a charitable trust for the Njamal People. He is also majority owner of Burrigarba, a Joint Venture with SRG Global that has secured long term contracts with FMG and BHP. Terry's focus is on creating a strong ecosystem of support and building for purpose and for profit business group that helps his family, the community and the Pilbara.



GLORIA LEE CULTURAL LEADER

Gloria Lee lives in Roebourne Western Australia, in Ngarluma country. Gloria is a Yindjibarndi woman, with her traditional land stretching as far as Millstream all the way around to the middle section of the valley running directly through Fortescue River and the nearby uplands.

My name is Jessica Wilson I am a Yindjibarndi/Njamaal woman from a small remote community located in the Pilbara region of Western Australia called Roebourne, I am youngest of my siblings "Nyirdingu", and a mother of two. Growing up in a small a community gave us the opportunity to learn how to hunt and track animals and survival skills if we ever got lost, we'd also would go out fishing.

After being encourages by my sister, the first artwork I did was called Creeks as the artwork reminded me of the beautiful fishing spots my parents would take us to. The artwork I painted was entered into the Cossack Art Awards that's held in the Pilbara annually by City Of Karratha where all Pilbara based artists enter. I went in just hoping I would sell my artwork I was fortunate enough to leave having win the "Young Emerging Category"
